



Cornetts IGA moves headquarters to North Lakes

NORTH Lakes will soon welcome a new major business with Cornetts IGA Group set to move its head office to the North Lakes Business Park.

Cornetts IGA group owns 45 stores in Queensland and has bought a site of almost 2000sq m on Flinders Pde.

The site will act as an administrative and management base and have a warehouse for on site storage. It is expected to open early this year.

Cornetts IGA Group chief executive officer Graham

Booyesen said the company was impressed with the modern design and facilities on offer in the North Lakes Business Park.

"With its strong population growth and great central location, we are very much looking forward to having our business based in North Lakes," Mr Booyesen said.

"Our site has a prominent position in the business park and our office will feature an attractive design with extensive landscaping in keeping with Stockland's overall

vision for the project.

"Our staff will also benefit from working in this vibrant new estate with its own recreational areas and nearby shopping, restaurants and cafes."

Stockland Development Manager Roger Moloney said Cornetts IGA would be a great addition to the business park.

Mr Moloney said the park continued to attract plenty of interest.

"Stockland still has limited lots available in Stages 2 and

3 of the business park, with sizes ranging from 1982sq m and 5117sq m," he said.

"Stage 6 will also be released soon and offers super lots ranging from two to four hectares, which have already attracted strong early interest.

"There seems to be a shortage of large industrial sites in the northern corridor that are ready for development, especially sites with good highway access."
