STOCKLAND AND THE GOOD FOUNDATION CELEBRATE SUCCESS OF JAMIE'S MINISTRY OF FOOD AUSTRALIA PARTNERSHIP

Stockland and The Good Foundation are celebrating three successful years as partners delivering the Jamie's Ministry of Food cooking program across Australia.

Since December 2014, Stockland has helped The Good Foundation teach cooking skills to thousands of Australians from as far north as Cairns in Queensland to as far west as Baldivis in West Australia.

To date, over 6,700 people have completed the Jamie's Ministry of Food 7 week course, learning basic cooking skills and Jamie's hints and tips, to be able to cook healthy nutritious meals from scratch using fresh food.

Most importantly, many participants have directly changed their lifestyle and eating habits following the course participation, with an additional 24,000 cups of fruit and vegetables being consumed every week and people stating they feel were more confident in cooking meals from scratch and are spending less on take away foods.

The Jamie's Ministry of Food cooking course is based on Jamie Oliver's beliefs about cooking and the associated impact on healthy living, the basic home cooking course delivers hands-on cooking classes led by a team of dedicated Food Trainers and local volunteers and covers information on ingredients, shopping, budgeting, meal planning and food preparation for basic cooking.

- More than 6,500 people have participated in a Jamie's Ministry of Food Australia course through the Wetherill Park kitchen, outreach program or support of the mobile kitchen.
- Jamie's Ministry of Food has visited 10 Stockland asset locations over the past three years
- More than 3,500 people have taken a cooking course at the Jamie's Ministry of Food kitchen at Stockland Wetherill Park
- Some 70% of participants that have come to the program live within 10km of the centre
- An additional 24,000 cups of fruit and vegetables are being consumed by participants of the course every week
- 76 different community organisations have connected with the centre (with 14 doing multiple courses)
