## 2018 Highlights

Thank you for your 2018 support of the Australian Business and Community Network.

Last year, 686 students received encouragement from 208 professional mentors or volunteers from Stockland. This is a tremendous achievement and represents a near doubling of student numbers and over a 10% increase in mentor/volunteer numbers compared to 2017. In total in 2018, mentors and volunteers across Stockland gave 1426 hous of their time to the schools and students in our network and we sincerely thank them for all their work.

Stockland continues to be a generous supporter of the ABCN Scholarship Foundation and kindly funded a further two scholarships targeting Indigenous students during 2018. These were awarded to Harley from NSW and Talon from QLD, and they will be matched with Stockland mentors in early 2019.

Additionally, the first four students receiving Stockland-funded scholarships at the end of 2017 participated in the first full year of activities with their Stockland Mentors. The highlight was the Accelerate Leadership Summit in August in Sydney, where Dorji, Caellen, Nicole and Trent all had their mentors Tim Bloom, Nacho Rojo, Kathrine Andersen and Mitchell Brown accompanying them. Special mention should go Clare Pocock who accompanied her very nervous mentee, Monica, on the flight over from Perth.

Congratulations to Gemma Court on being awarded an ABCN Super Mentor Award! This a tremendous achievement with Gemma completing 10 sustained mentoring programs between 2013 and 2018. Many thanks to Gemma for her ongoing support to ABCN.

## 2018 Impact - Students



ABCN's impact framework measures the short and medium and long term impact of our programs. The impact statistics below reflect the outcomes of our mentoring programs to help disadvantaged youth improve their educational outcomes.

Impact statistics are based on data collected from all ABCN programs nationwide across all member companies and participating schools.

**93% of students** of students who participated in ABCN's flagship programs GOALS or Aspirations completed Year 12 or its equivalent *compared with a 74% national average and 61% of disadvantaged students* (Lamb et al. 2015)

**Over 60% of students** who participated in GOALS or Aspirations have accepted university study offers *compared with a 37% national average and 16% of disadvantaged students (Parr 2015)* 

**89% of students** of 48 students we tracked 10+ years after completing our GOALs program are fully engaged in education, employment and/or training *compared with a 73% national average and 63% of disadvantaged students* (Lamb et al. 2015)

#### **Case Study**

## Karlee Maitland, Aspirations and Focus Graduate

Karlee Maitland was ready to quit school altogether until she participated in ABCN's Aspirations program. The experience was life-changing, and Karlee has a newfound passion to achieve and succeed.

"My journey started towards the end of year 10. I felt unmotivated, I was disinterested in school, and suffered from a lack of self-confidence.

I entered the Aspirations Program with little direction and I exited the program with a clear career in mind, and armed with the many necessary skills required for the future. One of the best aspects of the program was the mentors, and one of my mentors I will be forever grateful for. The efforts he made to go above and beyond for me have made a big difference in my life.

After the Aspirations program I went on to another ABCN program, the female leadership program called Focus, which was especially eye opening. It opened my eyes to the diversity and skills amongst us young women. The program allowed for a free expression of my very outspoken personality and gave me the encouragement to feel comfortable in myself and leadership styles.

I am now headed into Year 12 (something I was not sure I was going to do) and I have achieved many new things: A new job, joining the recruitment process for the Army, receiving a leadership award, and obtaining the role of Vice School Captain."

## Student outcomes by program

Students rated each program on the following statements using a scale of 1 to 7 – where 5 is agree and 7 is strongly agree - prior to commencing the program and upon completion. For primary school programs, 1:2:1 and Spark, teachers are asked to complete the surveys based on their observations of their students' progress.

#### 1:2:1 - 164 students participated in 2018

Maths mentoring program for primary school students who are falling behind in the early years of mathematical literacy.

## Spark - 364 students participated in 2018

Reading mentoring program for primary school students who will benefit most from developing their literacy, language skills and socialisation.

### Accelerate - 59 students participated in 2018

Formerly known as ABCN's Foundation scholarship program, *Accelerate* is a one-on-one mentoring program over a sustained three-year period. High potential students are paired with a mentor for their final two years of secondary school and their first year of further education, employment or training.

#### FOCUS - 1049 students participated in 2018

Group mentoring for female year 11 students with female mentors in leadership positions, exploring the challenges of leadership through shared experience and personal reflection. Focus is three sessions of two hours duration over three weeks.
