



Hilltop Park opening Sunday

1.6ha feature of rapidly-selling Altrove release

MORE than 80 per cent of homes and lots in the latest release at Schofields development Altrove have been sold.

Developer Stockland said demand had been high when the lots and housing were released on March 25.

Stockland's NSW residential development general manager Richard Rhydderch said 112 townhouses were under construction, with residents to move in by July.

He said the 1.6ha Altrove Hilltop Park, set to be a landmark in the area, would be opened at 10am on Sunday.

"Approximately 300 lots

and townhomes have sold within the community," Mr Rhydderch said.

"We received a very positive response to the land and townhome release at Altrove last weekend and as a result 80 per cent of the release has been sold."

Mr Rhydderch said the planned amenities for Altrove would be a big drawcard for families.

"We expect a high level of demand to accompany this release as it also represents a great opportunity to obtain a new home in Sydney's north-west growth corridor," he said.

Mr Rhydderch said townhouses would have 2.5 bathrooms, airconditioning, one or two car spaces and kitchen appliances. The park will include play areas, a grassed recreational area, a play

tower and barbecue areas.

Stockland said the Altrove

development would feature playgrounds, bike tracks, fitness stations, a dog park and retail precinct.

The development's proposed Eat Street area would link the community with the adjacent Schofields train station.
