We hope you enjoy reading this community newsletter. In response to a number of questions received about amenity delivery at The Gables, we have provided a number of updates on construction in addition to community initiatives!





The Lake

The first stage of the lake construction which includes bulk earthworks has now been completed. The lake has now naturally filled following periods of rainfall.

The remaining stages of lake construction include the following:

- · Installation of water treatment systems to maintain the water quality of the lake
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Completion of landscaping work surrounding the lake edges (pathways, turfed areas, trees and vegetation)

Stockland are currently in discussions with The Hills Shire Council to finalise designs for the water treatment systems that will operate at The Gables lake. We are hoping to finalise designs and have these lodged with Council towards the end of 2021. Concept design work has commenced for landscaped areas surrounding the lake which involves the design of a number of important bridges to facilitate pedestrian access around the lake. We anticipate that the design work and consultation with Council will occur throughout the balance of 2021 and we are targeting lodgement of a DA with Council in 2022.



Playing Fields

We are working closely with The Hills Shire Council and are excited to be delivering the first playing fields at The Gables! These will be located between Fontana Drive. Red Gables Road and Cataract Drive.

Landscape architects have been engaged to finalise designs and approvals for the playing fields and we are targeting obtaining all necessary approvals by the end of 2021.

The facility is proposed to include two sporting fields, playground areas and amenities buildings as well as landscaping, walking/cycling paths and car parking.



We understand that residents of The Gables are eager to obtain an update on the proposed retail within The Gables. Stockland have engaged architects who are working on the design of the neighbourhood shopping centre and we are targeting lodgement of a DA with Council by end of 2021. We can also share that we are currently in discussions to secure a major supermarket operator! We will continue to update the community on the progress of the retail centre as we reach further milestones.



Transport

As many of you will have noticed The Gables now has a number of bus services in operation throughout the Estate. These services (740 and 741) connect our residents to important locations in the region such as Rouse Hill Town Centre and Riverstone Train station.
