

The best time to identify a dog that will not cope within the class environment is **before they enrol**.

## All dogs determined to be unsuitable for Foundation/Junior Foundation Class must be referred to <u>info@schoolfordogs.com.au</u> so that they can receive the help that they need.

The most common behaviour that will rule a dog out of Foundation Class is "dog reactivity". This means that, for any number of reasons, the dog will lunge, pull, bark/vocalise, or otherwise become highly stimulated by the presence of another dog. (They may be friendly or unfriendly, over-excited, frustrated, or afraid.) Regardless of the cause, these dogs should not be in class if they can't work safely.

Use the following questions as a rough guideline to determine class suitability.

- 1. Does your dog bark, lunge, or act fearful when it sees another dog when it is on a lead?
- A. **YES:** go to question 2.
- B. NO: your dog will most likely be suitable for class
- 2. Does your dog play well with dogs it doesn't know when off a lead?
- A. YES: Go to question 3
- B. NO: this dog is not suitable for class. Contact info@schoolfordogs.com.au

3. Can you distract your dog from barking at other dogs when it is on lead with food or toys?

A. YES, very easily: this dog is suitable for class with distance and visual barriers.

B. **SOMETIMES**, it depends: *this dog is needs to be assess prior to class. Contact* **info@schoolfordogs.com.au** 

C.NO, I can't distract the dog with anything: *this dog is not suitable for class. Contact* **info@schoolfordogs.com.au**
