Man-made lake taking shape at Newport

Construction on a new 22-hectare lake has passed the half-way mark with around 1,420,000 cubic metres of earth excavated from the site so far.


The new lake will form the central feature of our bayside community, providing a fantastic recreational facility for people who enjoy boating and water sports with direct access to Moreton Bay.

Every day more than two Olympic swimming pools of earth are removed from the lake site, which is due to be filled with two billion litres of sea water on completion.

The lake will provide beautiful water views for residents as they make the most of the future foreshore parks, footpaths, cycle ways and planned waterside retail and dining opportunities.

When the lake is completed it will have high mast access to Moreton Bay via a lock and two shared use zones for light paddle craft. Construction on the lake is expected to be completed by late 2018.

Newport Retirement Village update

We are well underway with construction of Newport's Retirement Village, with the first building reaching level 5 of 6 levels, consisting of 45 apartments.

Construction has also started on the state-of-the-art Community Centre. Newport Retirement Village will include 125 apartments in the heart of the Newport community overlooking the future lakeside park and across the road from the future Marketplace.

The design concept is focused on creating beautiful places for residents to socialise and connect with their neighbours and community, complimented by exemplary private amenity in their new apartment home. The proposed buildings are positioned to create a secure and private green space for residents, which is envisaged as the heart of the retirement community.

The Retirement Village will help families stay together. Families can encourage their parents and grandparents to make sea changes too, staying close and connected in the same community. Purpose-designed passive play spaces are proposed throughout the ground for grandchildren to enjoy, along with easy connectivity to the future lakeside park.

Eight CARE Grant Winners at Newport
