Display Village Launch a great success

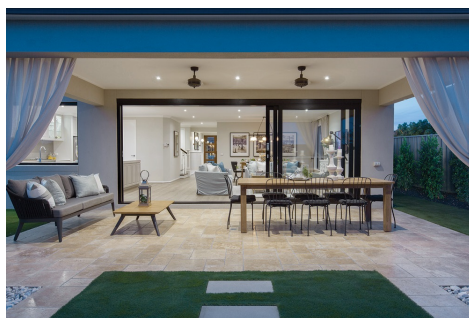
Cloverton was the place to be on Saturday, September 9, with more than 1,200 people turning out for a colourful spring event.

New playground opening April 2018

The rich cultural history of Cloverton has inspired the design of an exciting new park which is currently being built on 7,700 square metres on Dermody Avenue, at Cloverton.

The design of the park will feature active and passive play elements that tell the story of the Wurundjeri people, who are the traditional owners of the area and link the landscapes of Merri Creek and Bald Hill.

The highlights of the new play space include a fish trap net which children can climb through and multi-purpose sporting goals.

Meanwhile, sheltered picnic spots with seating will provide more tranquil spaces where residents can socialise or simply relax within the natural setting.

The park, which is being built adjacent to a reconstructed wetland environment located in the ecologically sensitive Merri Creek conservation area, will have a viewing platform for people to observe the aquatic bird life that will be attracted to the area.

The park is anticipated to open to the public in April 2018.



Live Life Get Active at Cloverton

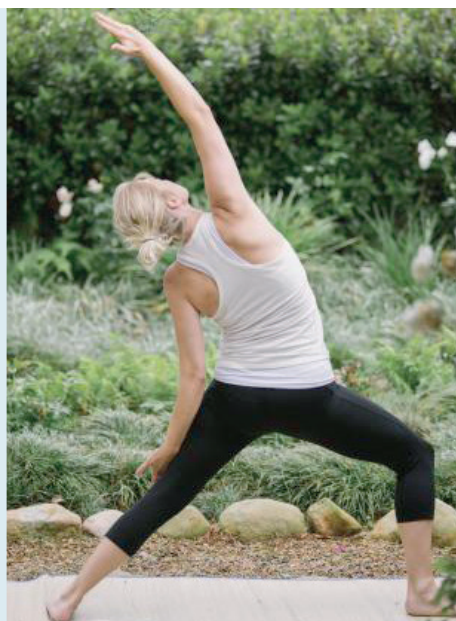
Live Life Get Active is a social initiative that looks to build a fitter, healthier and happier Australia.
