Signalised Intersection at Dwyer Street/Donnybrook Road

This significant intersection for the Cloverton community is about to get a signalised make over.

Construction works to upgrade the intersection are anticipated to commence in August this year, please read below how this will impact traffic:

- The road will be under traffic management conditions from August where there may be some delays as traffic is managed and speeds reduced
- The works will take approximately 12 months to deliver the intersection
- Works will be carried out 9.30am – 3.30pm on weekdays

Title Registrations

Stages 306, 307, 308 & 309 (200 lots) have recently registered, and stages 314, 315 & 317 (159) are anticipated to register by end-2019 to early-2020. In July Cloverton reached a community milestone of 1,000 people settling on their land.

Bike Park


Construction on the Bike Park on Bells Avenue has just commenced and it's anticipated to open this summer!

The park is designed around a bike theme and will incorporate a bike loop with a bike repair station, playground, a shelter with seating facilities, drinking fountain, fitness station and a kick-about oval.



Regional Playing Fields

Earthworks for the Regional Playing Fields located on Goodman Avenue have just commenced. The Playing Fields will feature two football/cricket ovals, tennis courts and an adventure playground. Following completion of the earthworks, it's anticipated that landscape works will commence in summer 2019/2020.



Green Leaves Early Learning Centre

Construction is well underway on a new state-of-the-art Early Learning Centre, located next to the Cloverton Sales Centre. The works are anticipated to be complete by the end of this year, with the centre anticipated to open early 2020. Street Update

In a response to resident concerns regarding vehicles driving too fast through the main roads in Cloverton, speed reduction signs have been installed to encourage drivers to drive slower and safer, protecting the community.

Nature Strips Update

It's everyone's responsibility to keep Cloverton looking beautiful. Stockland will complete the landscaping of all nature strips, usually within 3 months of a stage registering. Although nature strips are owned by Council, it is the responsibility of every resident to maintain the nature strip directly abutting their home – this includes regular mowing, maintenance and clearing of litter and rubbish.

As your nature strip landscape is installed before your home is constructed, it is important you ensure that any damage as a result of construction of your home is addressed by your builder before they finish construction.
