The highly anticipated Sustainable Park has recently opened with a fantastic launch event with over 200 Highlanders braving a cold, windy day to check out the new playground.

The playground has been constructed by reusing a range of construction materials including rocks, reclaimed house bricks and concrete pillars. In addition to the innovative playground elements there is plenty of seating in shaded areas and open space for ball games and picnicking.

Another feature of the park is the water fountain sculpture designed by local artist, Hijabee Art. Hijabee's design received the most votes from members of the community who voted from a selection of short-listed artists on Facebook.

It’s been a busy year at Highlands with 814 lots from 15 stages all registering bringing another 2,279 Highlanders to the community in the future.

Construction is now underway on a new dam within Aitken Creek. Once completed, this asset will control water flows throughout the drainage corridor and provide an important pedestrian link between our Waterview and Lakeside Villages. We’re expecting completion of the dam in early 2020.

The Highlander Drive Bridges that crosses Aitken Creek is now open. Residents can now drive from Craigieburn Road through to the Bridges Village getting you home faster.

Craigieburn station car park upgrade

VicTrack are delivering 745 new commuter car parking spaces at Craigieburn Station. The extended car park will be built along the eastern edge of the Hume Highway and will be linked to the station with a new footpath. The new car park will boost capacity to a total of 1,100 spaces and will include accessible parking for people of all abilities.

Two new primary schools opened
