STAGE 1:

Stamford Park Homestead

Occupying over 40 hectares of natural habitat, waterways and open space, Stamford Park is being developed into a place of true beauty – a place where people can live, work, play and enjoy life.

Stamford Park is also a place of historical significance. At the heart of Stamford Park is the Stamford Park Homestead, surrounded by its exotic gardens.

Built in 1882 by Edward Row, this living link to early European settlement is one of the last remaining 19th Century country Homesteads in Knox and the region. The development has seen the Homestead restored and sympathetically expanded to include a premier restaurant and dining experience.

STAGE 2:

Adventure Playground

Stage 2 of the Stamford Park redevelopment is set to commence in June 2020. The work is expected to take six months to complete.* Key features of the work include:

- Adventure play equipment including flying fox
- Fitness equipment
- Pathways & landscaping
- Picnic spaces

STAGE 3:

Wetlands & Parklands

Stage 3 wetlands development is the final step for Stamford Park and is anticipated to commence late 2020* with completion due in the second half of 2021.* This work will include:

- Shared walk & cycle paths
- Playground
- Boardwalks through the wetlands
- Landscaping and revegetation works including a lookout tower and village green for community events
- A specially designed habitat for the local platypus colony
